

This is the first special election in Nebraska to fill a vacancy in the U.S. House of Representatives since 1951. Due to the timing of the resignation of Congressman Jeff Fortenberry, which occurred on March 31, 2022, it was decided to hold the election on June 28 to allow enough time for military and overseas citizens ballots to be delivered and so as to not overlap with our statewide primary election held on May 10.

Normally, special elections are not held in the month of June in even-numbered years, and special elections are to be held on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in a given month. The statutory requirement to conduct this election within 90 days of the resignation, however, superseded these other statutory requirements and resulted in the setting of this unique election date.

In addition, since the vacancy occurred in the year after redistricting took place, the newly adopted boundaries for the First Congressional District were used for this special election, in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. §32-504 which became effective on October 1, 2021, rather than the old boundaries.

Once again, our election officials rose to the challenge. I commend the election officials within the First Congressional District for their work holding this election on the heels of having conducted the statewide primary election.
