EGYPT MARKET OVERVIEW

Though Egypt and Nebraska do not yet have a formal trade agreement, there are plenty of opportunities for Nebraska companies to advance their business goals in the Egyptian market. With a GDP of over \$402 billion and a strategic location that could open doors to doing business in neighboring countries, now is a great time to invest in a growing market with a lot to offer.

Nebraska businesses and educational institutions are already seeing great success in the MENA (Middle East and North Africa) region, particularly in tackling water scarcity through Nebraska-built irrigation systems and in the medical sector through Nebraska-run training programs.



Egypt ranks 41st among the United States' largest export markets and is the top market in Africa. Agriculture accounts for 28% of the Egyptian job market, 11.3% of the GDP and the country relies on imports of wheat and corn, top Nebraska products. Egypt also has a large tourism market with a growing demand for high-quality beef.



In 2024, the United States traded an estimated \$8.6 billion with Egypt. An estimated \$6.1 billion of that sum were exports (up 36% from 2023) and \$2.5 billion were imports (up 6.7% from 2023).
